

Snoqualmie Falls Forest Theater & Family Park Facilities Use Summary (B)

Welcome to Snoqualmie Falls Forest Theater. This park is a private 95-acre park, managed for the benefit of our members, their guests and our theater patrons. We do have a few rules and regulations that must be followed; some requirements are for your safety and enjoyment, and others that are required by King County and the State of Washington.

1. Sanitary:

- Use toilet facilities provided.
- Wrap garbage, deposit in covered containers and then seal the containers tightly.
- Combustible refuse may be burned or placed in covered container.
- Deposit non-combustible refuse in covered containers.

2. Fires:

- Always have a responsible adult present when building, sustaining, and putting out a fire.
- Build only in designated fire pits in the camping or picnic areas.
- Have bucket of water available. Ensure the fire is DEAD OUT before leaving.
- During state or county designated BURN BANS, absolutely no campfires are allowed.

3. Driving:

- Speed limit is 10 MPH.
- Park in designated parking areas only.
- The driveway to the A-frame, caretaker's residence, and restrooms are off limits to guests' and members' vehicles.

4. Food and Drink:

- Food and drink are not permitted in the amphitheater, stage, or seating area during performances or public activities, unless served by the Forest Theater.
- The use of alcoholic beverages is limited to beer and wine and is restricted to the public eating and picnic area.
- No one under the current legal age (21) for purchasing alcoholic beverages in the State of Washington is permitted to drink in the park.

5. Smoking:

- Is permitted in designated areas only, unless there are severe fire weather conditions, then no smoking is allowed on the property.
- Not permitted on trails or forested areas.
- Not permitted in any of the buildings (kitchen, office, BBQ shelter, restrooms, etc.).
- Not permitted in theater area (including light booth, concession stand, Quonset hut, etc.).

6. Pets:

- Not allowed in the theater area, kitchen, office, or restrooms.
- Must be under control of the owners at all times and on a leash when requested by others.
- Guide dogs are allowed.

7. Firearms and other Weapons:

Not permitted on premises unless used in performances or controlled demonstrations.

8. Facilities:

- Permanent restrooms open year-round.
- Kitchen use, permitted by members and/or guests in conjunction with scheduled events (fee applies).
- 9. Easement Highlights: Each of these items may result in a \$1,000.00 fine per violation.
 - The easement covers the <u>private property</u> between the key-card operated main gate at the end of David Powell Road and the metal gate which bears the SFFT Welcome Sign (approximately 500 yards up the road from the main gate).
 - <u>Do not walk</u> on the easement and/or approach the Country Gardens residence. It is also a violation for any member or guest to approach the private residences requesting directions or information.
 - Dogs <u>must</u> either be confined in a vehicle, secured with a leash, or in a carrier, and under handlers control at all times while traversing the easement. Members of the Theater and others using the Roadway Easement should be courteous to the owners and occupants of the Country Gardens Property and be reasonably quiet while on the Roadway Easement.' (Sec 12.1)
 - Members and invitees shall not "place signs, decorations, balloons, banners or markings of any kind on the Roadway Easement", the gate, or the property between the end of the SE David Powell Rd and the SFFT wooden gate. (Sec 12.2)
 - "Removing or otherwise interfering with the Theater's temporary sign" is a violation (Sec 16.2.1). If the sign has blown over, please contact the person in charge of the event immediately.
 - Exercising common courtesy when using the road and remembering we are crossing
 privately held residential property will go a long way in preventing any future violations and
 make the park a better experience for everyone!

Although this is only a <u>summary of the rules and regulations</u>, we hope that this information will be beneficial in your understanding of the agreement we have made with our neighbors to use their land to access our park, and other requirements of the county and state.
